
DUE TO THE HOLIDAYS THERE WAS NO RAMBLE IN DECEMBER

CATASETUMS by Olivier Turina

Catasetums are sometimes hard to find when you live in South Florida because they are dormant in the Winter & early Spring when we have most of our orchid shows. So you will have a hard time finding them at our South Florida shows. The one at the Bonnet House in early December (now held in April this year) is the most likely to carry catasetums. There are obviously other ways to get them!

Catasetum species are found in Central and South America and they are a must in your collection as they offe beautiful and original shapes, colors and fragrances. Some flowers like Ctsm. pileatum and Cyc. chlorochilon have huge fragrant flowers. They also bloom in the Summer and early Fall when most other orchids are not in bloom. So you extend your own blooming season/pleasures with these orchids.

They also have beautiful foliage in season and you get a rest with zero needed care for 2 to 4 months a year!They are also very forgiving of cultural mistakes giving you opportunities to redeem yourself.

They are actually very easy to grow once you understand their lifecycle. All you have to do is observe them and they will tell you exactly what they need.

Here is their typical yearly life cycle:

- In its dormant stage, a catasetum has no leaves & the old bulbs are bare. At that time, you do NOT WATER AT ALL (unless there is only one bulb which is extremely shriveled). The bulbs are filled with water and are there to ensure survival during dormancy.
- As soon as a new shoot appears, HOLD OFF on watering until the shoot and the roots are 3 to 5" long!!! New shoots are extremely sensitive to rot and refraining from watering also forces the plant to grow more roots which will lead to stronger bulbs and hopefully more flowers. If you need to repot, now is the time, right when the new shoot appears and has no roots yet.
- When the shoots and roots are 3 to 5" long, it is monsoon time!!! You keep them wet at all times & fertilize regularly. The bulbs are then growing incredibly fast and turn into beautiful geysers of green. Most flowers only appear when the bulb is mature but some smaller catasetums & Ctsm. tenebrosum tend to grow flowers while the bulbs are still growing.
- When the leaves start yellowing or die, it is time to reduce watering and fertilizing. When all the leaves are gone, the plant is back to dormancy and you start the cycle all over again.

Please note that in general, dormancy is in the winter, new shoots early Spring & you water like crazy in late Spring and Summer and start reducing water in the Fall. Those are just indications though. All you have to do is observe the plant and treat it according to what I described above. Some have very short dormancies while others can stay dormant for 4 months!

While dormant, in my experience the best location is under an overhang where no water reaches the plant butplenty of light is better. Catasetums require high light in general, more than cattleyas but less than vandas although they will take full sun. Too much light though risks producing more female flowers which are not desirable (see next article).

The ideal medium is sphagnum moss for catasetums but bark and inert material is preferable for cycnoches and mormodes who are more susceptible to rot.

FYI: Patience, Mother Nature and Her Variables!

Patience, an attribute you must endure while waiting on Mother Nature. With patience, we as orchid hobbyists eventually learn to grow and bloom magnificent specimens. Flowers that we show off at our monthly society meetings, hoping for a ribbon and occasionally taking a plant to one of the American Orchid Society (AOS) judging centers for a higher accolade being an AOS award.

It is only a matter of time before a hobbyist sees a plant they can't live without. Adding said plant to their collection and hoping for a season of phenomenal blooms. When putting oneself in that position, be sure to do the research on the plant's specific requirements. All too often, so many hobbyists will attempt to grow/bloom something that may not do well in their climate. Or they may not have enough knowledge and understanding of the plant's needs (do your research).

Regarding patience, we all want our newly acquired plants to grow and bloom into beautiful specimens. Some may turn into that specimen in two or three years while others may take two or three years longer.

Understanding this will most likely keep us from pulling our hair out of our heads

Every aspect of growing orchids has a variable; parameters in the requirements of the plant's culture. Meet those requirements and we are graced with the results we seek. How is the plant potted and with what medium or is the plant mounted and to what type of material.

Water plays an extremely important part in the plant's culture. It is the moisture the plant requires and the delivery system of nutrients as well as systemic fungicides and pesticides protecting the plant; but is that water from a well, from a city water line or reverse-osmosis water. Using water from a city line contains various chemicals that can build up in the plant and the medium the plant is growing in. It is a good practice to flush the plant's root system with RO water or rain water whenever possible. This process washes away amounts of the salts and residues left behind by city water. You most also think about the amount of water required and when the water should be administered.

Light should be monitored with the plant being placed in an area that is conducive to that individual plant's culture. Reading culture sheets for example will give you a parameter or a range of light that the plant will require. Last but not least, a constant air movement is vital to help dry the plant after watering and helps prevent the onset of various diseases.

As we gain experience, the quality of the orchids we grow should improve. Taking the time and doing research will save time, money and the mortality rate of our plants. Please keep in mind, what works for one person may not for another. Use suggestions and other's ideas as starting points. Happy growing!







To all buyers of our live sales: here's the basic info you'll need!

- 1. Anyone in the United States can buy from us, you just need to watch our live sale and bid by commenting on the live feed with the corresponding code for the plant you wish to purchase (alternates will be contacted if first buyer falls through)
- 2. Shipping to the lower 48 is \$25 per box. The box is 24" x 10" x 8" and three to five potted plants will fit in there (more if you bare root your plants) without the price changing.

 If you buy during the live sale and want to fill the rest of your box, contact us directly for help with that. It may take a few days to fill up your box, so shipping may be delayed till later that week or till the next week, we do our best to get your order out in a timely matter!
- 3. We take credit cards and PayPal, if you want us to hold your order till after the next live sale, we may have you pay for the plants you have but we will absolutely hold them for you!
- 4. Let us know if you would like your shipment delayed by Monday. We can hold shipments to accommodate weather, vacation, etc. Otherwise, all shipping will go out on Tuesday or Wednesday.
- 5. Plants are guaranteed to arrive healthy, flowers and buds are not guaranteed but we haven't had a problem shipping budded or in flower plants.
- 6. Culture sheets are in a photo album on our page, if you have questions or concerns, message us anytime!
