
Special prayers & get wishes go out to our long time member Chris Binder who is recovering from some medical issues.

Also prayers continue for our member Arleen Gross who is still recovering at home but doing much better. We hope she will be able to return to our next meeting.



An eligible plant is one that stands out as grown to its fullest potential, in robushealt h, displaying an unusually high number of blooms. Cultural merit is not necessarily related to size; it is related to quality. This award is not necessarily given out each month.

MARCH ORCHID GROWING

Vanda Motes Adorbs_ many in spike now. February has been both warmer and wetter than usual. Several cold fronts lingered and produce extra moisture but not overly cold temperatures for more than a few nights. While relative humidity has been higher than usual, the higher temperatures have created nonetheless greater than usual drying potential which is highly favorable to our plants. This high drying of the air has also produced wide swings of day to night temperature. These conditions have stimulated our vandas to greater growth and blooming and dendrobiums and other sympodial orchids have also been stimulated to break into growth earlier than they typically do. All of this growth should be fed. This year it is not too early to apply time release fertilizer now. All time release fertilizers are not equal: Nutri-coat which is marketed under the brand name Dynamite has a superior polymer coating which has proved more reliable under the higher temperatures of South Florida. Lowe's sells a six-month, low phosphorus, formula that approximates the Michigan State recommended ratio of nutrients. Its superior qualities make it worth the effort to obtain it. Low phosphorus liquid fertilizer can also be now be regularly applied as well.

As sympodial orchids are getting an early start on the growing season, we need to get an early start on repotting them if need be. Our plants are not alone in getting an early start: snails are waking early from their winter rest in the warm wet world. Those tender new growths on our orchids are a delightful breakfast for these pests. A single snail once destroyed 50 young, emerging flower spikes on a bench of dendrobiums at Motes Orchids. Remember, always apply snail bait lightly, one pellet per 3 to four square feet but apply it often every 2 weeks for 3 applications. That should achieve control until the summer rains allow our neighbors to share their far-ranging snails with us.

As temperatures rise into the 80's the ever-present threat of Thrips emerges. Scout for them early morning or use a yellow sticky trap to detect them. The first sign of damage is usually to the new tips of roots where pitted marks show up at the point where the green is maturing into white. Soap applied liberally, coating the entire plant at the rate of 2 oz per gal of water works well. Insecticidal soap is best but as orchids are waxy plants, dishwashing liquid rarely does harm. Be sure that plants are watered thoroughly the day before applying soap. Other control measures for Thrips are presented in Fla. Orchid Growing and Fla Vanda Growing.

High temperatures and low humidity mean our vandas will need water every day. They will also enjoy fertilizer which should be substituted for water at every 6th watering. Potted plants in terra cotta will also dry faster than one might expect. They too need water and fertilizer to sustain the best new growth.Our orchids are enjoying this weather and we are reminded why we live in Florida

TASKS FOR MARCH Watch out for mites. Spray for thrips.Repot genera emerging from dormancy: catasetums, calanthes, and soft cane dendrobiums.Continue general re-potting of cattleyas, oncidiums, hard-cane dendrobiums, etc. Make top cutting of teretes, semi-teretes, and reed stem epidendrums.Move landscape plants gradually to brighter light. Apply time-release fertilizer.
